Budget 2024 and Medium-Term Expenditure Framework 2024-2027 at a glance

The budgetary forecast 2024-2027 overall reflects the investments, medium-term budgetary challenges and financial relief measures:

- The core budget deficit amounts to 20.9 bn € in 2024 and falls to 16.9 bn € by 2027.
- The Maastricht deficit is below 3.0% of GDP from 2024 to 2027.
- The public debt ratio falls slightly to below 77% of GDP by the end of the planning period.


 With the budget 2024 and the Medium-Term Expenditure Framework 2024-2027, the Federal Government is continuing its active fiscal policy of recent years:
